As vision needs seem to be increasing in our Early Head Start population, we feel that these screenings are vital to our Early Head Start families. Wayne Houser and his team of Lion's Club volunteers were thoroughly professional, organized and worked well with our children ranging in age from 7 months to 4 years old. Several adults and children were identified as having a need for further screening. As children are not routinely screened until age 3 and a large percentage of our adults have never had a vision screening, we feel that these screenings can provide early detection of eye issues that may go undetected for years.
